Summit Location and Lodging

The 2011 Womens Advocacy & Leadership Summit will be held at the Radisson Hotel Baton Rouge, 2445 Acadian Thruway, Baton Rouge Louisiana 70808. Registration, which includes lodging and meals during the Summit schedule, is free. Participants are responsible for travel and related fees to and from Baton Rouge.

Post-Summit Advocacy Project

As a participant you will be asked to partner with an AIDS Service Organization (ASO), community-based organization, religious institution, womens or LGBTQ group, or other entity to carry out a grassroots organizing project that will be carried out after the Summit and may be continued indefinitely. Organizing projects should link womens HIV & AIDS priority issues, C2EA demands (treatment, research, prevention & respect), pressing local needs and development of grassroots networks. We encourage participants to develop a project that is particularly relevant to your community surrounding HIV & AIDS.

In particular think about the following questions:

1. How is HIV & AIDS affecting you and your peers?
2. What is your community, church, or local government doing about it?
3. What changes would you like to see in your local community?
4. What gaps in services can you identify in your community?

Essay Questions (use separate sheet of paper for answers)

Please answer each of the following questions as completely and accurately as possible.

1. When did you first realize HIV & AIDS was something people fight against? What were the implications to you? (1-2 Paragraphs)
2. What is your experience (personal, volunteer, or work- related) with HIV & AIDS and have you participated in any advocacy or activism around the issue?
3. What skills or knowledge are you hoping to gain by attending the Womens Advocacy & Leadership Summit? What would be most useful to you organizing around HIV & AIDS in your community? (1-2 Paragraphs)
4. Please outline an advocacy project you will be committed to carrying out for at least two (2) months after the Summit. Include names of organizations you plan to partner with, fundraising plans, and overall goals for your project.
5. Are you committed to continuing the work of the Campaign to End AIDS post conference? To what capacity?
